- Investing in technology and **digital transformation** for operational efficiency.


#### 5. Innovation and Adaptability

Why this goal matters	<ul> <li>Advancing research ensures better outcomes for patients by developing new therapies and improving early detection.</li> <li>It solidifies ERA's position as a global leader in nephrology and enhances the overall quality of care.</li> </ul>
Actions	<ul> <li>Identify key research areas that need to be developed (e.g., AI in nephrology, rare kidney diseases).</li> <li>Host scientific meetings to produce important ERA backed documents.</li> <li>Showcase innovative projects during the ERA Congress.</li> <li>Introduce a Registry communication platform with downloadable and visualized data reports.</li> </ul>

Context	Many cases of chronic kidney disease (CKD) are preventable with proper education and early intervention. However, public awareness of kidney health remains low in many regions, leading to delayed diagnoses and worse outcomes.
Why this goal matters	<ul> <li>Raising awareness empowers individuals to take preventive actions, reducing the burden of kidney diseases on healthcare systems.</li> <li>Prevention-focused strategies align with ERA's mission of promoting kidney health for all.</li> </ul>
Actions	<ul> <li>Develop international awareness campaigns with multilingual educational materials (i.e. culturally tailored content for diverse populations).</li> <li>Partner with schools and communities to disseminate information on risk factors.</li> <li>Promote regular kidney function screenings.</li> </ul>

Context	The nephrology workforce is facing challenges, including burnout, declining interest among medical students, and limited professional development opportunities. Expanding and engaging the kidney care community is essential for sustaining high-quality kidney care.
Why this goal matters	<ul> <li>A well-connected and engaged kidney care community enhances knowledge-sharing and collaboration.</li> <li>Investing in professional growth ensures a strong future workforce in nephrology.</li> <li>A dynamic network fosters leadership development and career progression.</li> </ul>
Actions	<ul> <li>Create a European nephrology curriculum and enhance the current nephrology exam.</li> <li>Offer fellowships and networking opportunities for early-career professionals.</li> <li>Promote diversity in leadership by supporting underrepresented groups.</li> </ul>
